Who is eligible?

Any student enrolled between April 2016 and April 2017 in a studio art or design course that is within the BCC Art Program.

What types of works are eligible?

Any BCC art/design studio course work produced between April 2016 and April 2017.

All work must be original and not have been previously exhibited in the gallery. Works should arrive ready for installation.

Any work that does not meet the entry requirements will not be accepted.

If your work is difficult or complex to install please be prepared to assist the staff during the installation period.

Number of works that may be submitted

No more than four works total per student may be submitted for consideration.

Instructions for Submitting Works to the Exhibition

What constitutes a work?

A painting, drawing, or sculpture is considered one work. Works that are comprised of more than one

part or contain multiple images or elements, such as a series of related drawings will be considered only as space allows. Consult with your instructor or gallery director if you want to submit a series of works.

In the case of Graphic Design, a single project might be composed of more than one element and in order to be understood must be seen as a single entity. Again, inclusion of these works is considered as space allows.

For site specific works or installation projects, please submit a written proposal with sketches or other materials that support the concept.

Electronic media must be submitted on a standard USB Flash Drive.

Video must be in saved as MP4 format.

Graphic design and print media may be mounted on black mat board or mounted flush on foamcore. Do not use hanging wires or hooks on mat board.

All other works on paper – drawings, prints, photographs, collage, and illustrations must arrive to the gallery matted (cream or white mat only) or matted and framed.

Stretched canvases may be left unframed, and if not warped, need not be installed with hanging wire.

Any works deemed unstable or comprised of materials that may pose a direct danger to staff or visitors will not be considered.

If unsure about the eligibility or presentation requirements of any work please see your instructor or the gallery director. Any special installation instructions are to be in writing and included when you submit your work.
