RETIRING ADMINISTRATOR LEAVES LAST MARK WITH A GIFT TO THE BCC FOUNDATION CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

After 31 years of service at Bristol Community College, retiring Vice President for College Communications Sally Chapman Cameron thought there was one last thing she wanted to leave behind. So she made an unrestricted gift of \$50,000 to the BCC Foundation's Capital Campaign, to be used as needed for the John J. Sbrega Health and Science building.

The Bristol Community College Board of Trustees approved recognizing the gift in a courtyard outside the Sbrega building, engraved with "Dedicated to those who change the world, learner by learner."

The engraving captures the spirit of the College's Vision Statement, which Cameron had a part in crafting. "As I complete my career at Bristol, I wanted to recognize the many administrators, faculty, and staff who take such care in educating our students," said Cameron. "Throughout my time at Bristol, I have seen the employees' commitment and the College's commitment to that Vision Statement. It means a lot to me to have this statement inscribed in the hardscape as the College begins its second 50 years."

"This gift illustrates the commitment of many of the College's employees to the mission of the institution," said Don Smyth, president of the BCC Foundation. "Not only do they give their time and effort, but also their treasure. Sally Cameron has played a significant and vital role at the College during her distinguished career at BCC, and this is yet another demonstration of it."

The BCC Foundation is engaged in "Imagine. Invest. Transforming Bristol Community College," with a goal of raising \$10 million for facilities and scholarships. The Campaign has raised nearly \$5 million at this point, much of it toward the equipping of the Sbrega Health and Science building. The new facility, set to open this month, is the largest Zero Net Energy science laboratory building on the East Coast. With geothermal wells, passive solar, and electricity generated by the largest solar parking canopy in Massachusetts, the building has already won sustainability awards for its creative use of technology to power the building.
