



#### Overview

This transfer agreement confirms that students who graduate from Bristol Community College's Registered Nurse (RN) program with a minimum 2.5 grade point average and pass the NCLEX-RN exam will be admitted to Fitchburg State University's online RN to Bachelor of Science (BS) in Nursing program.

### **Admissions Process**

Students are guaranteed admission if they successfully graduate with all required courses at Bristol and have a valid nursing license in good standing.

## **Student Obligations**

Additionally, students must earn a grade of 77 (C+) or higher in BIO 239 (Elements of Microbiology), BIO 233 (Human Anatomy and Physiology I), and BIO 234 (Human Anatomy & Physiology II) prior to registration at Fitchburg State. Students must submit their final Bristol transcript showing completion of the ADN program with a minimum overall 2.5 grade point average and their valid nursing license in good standing is confirmed. Students must complete 32 credits of Nursing at Fitchburg State University.

### **Student Benefits**

Students are welcome to participate in all health and nursing related special events on campus such as speaker series or student-focused events. Academic credits earned as part of the required RN program at Bristol will be applied towards the bachelor's degree at Fitchburg State University. A maximum of 88 credits can transfer to Fitchburg State University RN to BS program. Students who complete all the required and recommended general education courses in this agreement have completed the Associate Degree Block which covers their general education requirements at Fitchburg State.

## **Terms of the Agreement**

This agreement has been renewed May 2025 and is in effect through May 2028.
