## SIZE AND SCOPE

Bristol Community College has an undergraduate population of 12,514 (unduplicated head-count of credit students for 2013-14) and 19,256 in noncredit enrollments.

## STUDENT COSTS

Annual in-state tuition and fees: \$4,286

Annual out-of-state tuition and fees: \$9,230

Per credit charge of \$171 plus additional program-specific charges as applicable.

## BUDGET

Bristol Community College's operating budget for Fiscal Year 2014 is \$68 million, including state support of \$18.1 million and \$31.7 million in federal, state, and private grants.

In FY14, more than \$27.6 million in federal, state, and local financial aid was disbursed to 7,004 students. In Fall 2014, 47% of students are receiving Pell Grants and 21% of students are receiving loans.

The Bristol Community College Foundation awarded \$182,268 in scholarships and awards to 335 recipients. The Foundation issued 112 loans totaling \$20,536 to assist students.

## THIS YEAR'S HIGHLIGHTS . . .

### *New center in Taunton*

Bristol Community College opened a comprehensive new center in Taunton this fall, bringing together all Taunton-based credit and noncredit classes and services to the former Taunton Catholic Middle School. The new facility, located just off the Taunton Green, enables the College to offer classes day and evening, as well as having one location for high school equivalency, adult literacy, and career certificate programs. More than 375 students enrolled at the new site this fall, up 51% from the year before.
